## SPOTLESS TOWN OF GREAT RENOWN

**Chisholm to Have Its Sunday  
Clothes On, Its Face Washed  
and Hair Combed.**

Dr. A. W. Graham, chairman of the board of health and Assistant Health Officer Andrew Haglund are on the war path against dirt and will endeavor to make the village a spotless town. There is a village ordinance as well as a state law compelling tenants or owners of residences to use galvanized air tight garbage cans with fly proof lids and it is the intention of the board of health to strictly enforce the law. The village has already been cleaned up once but a second scouring over is to be given it for the next ten days. The village will stand the expense of hauling off the dirt but property owners are expected to place the rubbish in the garbage cans as provided by law. Garbage placed in the cans must be clear of iron or other non-destructible materials. Every owner of a cow or bull, goat, sheep, hog, etc., must have a manure can that is fly proof and with air tight lid.
