



Monthly and Seasonal Camping Policies & Procedures

The following rules and regulations are established to maintain high standards of safety, cleanliness, and maintenance, with a “Good Neighbor Policy” in mind. Since every contingency cannot be covered in a set of rules, from time to time, modification may be necessary.

Your adherence to this policy is very much appreciated and will ensure a pleasant stay for all guests.

Vehicles (Personal and Recreational)

- Please maintain a speed limit of 5 mph when approaching and departing designated camping area.
- Vehicles are only to be parked within the footprint of the site being rented, unless otherwise arranged with campground management.
- Campers/RVs are subject to the “10 year rule”
- No immobile vehicles allowed in the campground.
- ATV and other motorized vehicles are allowed in the campground. Please no riding around the campground outside of entering and leaving.
- One personal vehicle per site unless approved by campground management.

Sites

- Pack it in, pack it out. Please do a sweep of your camp area upon departure to leave the site better than it was found.
- Please be considerate of sound. We allow generators for campers and using best judgement on placement and times of usage to accommodate a quiet camping environment for all is appreciated.
- Sewer dump station free with reservation.
- Sites must be maintained and kept clutter free. A limited number of grills, camp chairs, bicycles, water jugs, and similar are approved equipment/items that can be left outside of the camper. Campground management (including campground hosts) can request, at their discretion, the clean up and/or removal of anything in excess of what is listed here. *The atmosphere at Iron Trail Campground is that of camping, not living.*

Pets

- Pets are welcome at Iron Trail Campground. Pets must be on a six foot or shorter leash, or contained in a carrier, camper, tent, or structure at all times and be cleaned up after.
- If pet waste is not cleaned up after, \$50.00 will be added to the camper’s fee.
- Aggressive, loud, and nuisance pets will not be allowed at Iron Trail Campground. Any complaints about a pet will be addressed by campground management and can result in camper being asked to leave.
- A \$3.50 pet fee is applied to each reservation.

Guests and Visitors

- No nuisance, disorderly, or aggressive behavior will be allowed.
- Loud parties and excessive alcohol consumption or drug use is not permitted.
- Visitors outside of registered camper(s) as agreed upon during registration *are not* allowed to stay overnight. Campground policy allows for two registered campers per site. A third camper increases the monthly rate by \$100.00. Visitors must be accompanied by registered guests. Excessive visitation by visitors may be considered a nuisance.
- Campers cannot rent their sites to a second party without approval by campground management.



Emergency and Safety

- In case of emergency, dial 911.
- Direct non-emergency lines: Chisholm Ambulance Services 218-254-7902, Chisholm Fire Department 218-254-7915, Chisholm Police Department 218-254-7915.
- If an emergency call is made and time allows, please call Larry Folstad 218-969-5538 or Bridgit Maruska 218-969-6408 so staff can be prepared to escort the emergency personnel to your site.
- If you observe any activity you believe to be of concern, contact Larry Folstad or Bridgit Maruska at numbers provided. (No soliciting allowed.)
- During times of extreme fire danger, campfires in raised pits and charcoal grills are not allowed. Please confirm with the office prior to arrival.

Miscellaneous

- Campfires are permitted in above ground fire pits only. Above ground fire pits are provided at each campsite during the regular camping season. During the camping season, campground staff will collect ashes. Cold ashes may be dumped in garbage receptacle.
- Only burn wood in firepits please. Dispose of garbage in receptacles provided or pack out.
- Fireworks are not permitted in the campground.
- Firewood is available at the Iron Trail Campground Office (115 6th Ave. SW) for \$6.00/bundle, please place cash in drop box.
- No non-standard electric heaters allowed. In colder months, no electric heating sources allowed outside of heated blanket. Propane heaters must be utilized. Camper is responsible for setting up propane. Tank rentals available at L&L Rentals Inc., 218-262-5232. 100lb tanks recommended.
- Cooling units utilizing electricity are only allowed in insulated campers.
- Generators allowed, bring extra cords to allow space between your camper and other guests to respect space and sound.

General Info

- Camp Office hours are M-F 7:00am – 3:20pm and flexible by appointment, camp staff and hosts on site at Iron Trail Campground and can be reached at 218-421-7158.
- Quiet time is 10:00pm to 6:00am.
- Campers are responsible for keeping their possessions and property secured. Iron Trail Campground is not responsible for lost or stolen items.
- Campers can reserve a seasonal (monthly rate) site a year in advance. To lock in a site for the following year, first month's payment is due at the time of reservation. Because the cancellation policy applies, campers must contact Iron Trail Campground in advance to change arrival date or cancel.
- Cancellation policy: \$15 fee 7 or more days in advance, \$25 fee 7-1 days in advance, 50% of full reservation 1 day or less in advance
- Occupied campers on site between November and April must have an all-weather, 4 season winter package.
- If Iron Trail Campground is full or not the ideal location for a large group of campers, Overflow camping at the St. Louis County Fairgrounds is available, registration is coordinated by Bridgit Maruska 218-254-7909. Check-in and out times confirmed upon registration and in writing on invoice.
- Winter storage is available on the upper level (middle sites) of the campground for 100.00/season (Nov 1 – April 30). Campers stored for winter are inaccessible outside of owner clearing snow off roofs. If they are accessed, the regular daily rate goes into effect.



Payment

- Iron Trail Campground prefers to conduct payment business through the website and payment site Camplife.com.
- Iron Trail Campground requires a card on file for electronic payment.
- Payments can be made in full for entire length of stay or monthly, with a selected date for payment to be automatically deducted from card on file. Payment for a month of stay must be paid prior to the stay. Payment for a May 1 camping reservation will be collected mid-April to lock in a reservation.
- Payments for winter storage of campers must be made prior to storage. Campers/RVs in winter storage will be charged the daily rate of camping after April 30th if camper is left on grounds and no monthly/weekly/or daily camping reservation and payment is made.
