

Public Participation Policy

Chisholm City Council Meetings

CITY OF CHISHOLM

EFFECTIVE: FEBRUARY 14TH, 2018

City Council meetings are limited to the public participation portion of the meeting.

Individuals who wish to address the council must sign up at the podium, located in the Council Chambers, prior to the meeting. Five (5) minutes will be allowed per speaker. If several members of the public wish to speak on the same subject, the Mayor may assign one (1) person as spokesperson.

Individuals/groups displaying disruptive behavior such as interruption of other speakers, personal attacks, engaging in improper comments, profanity, vulgarities, threats of violence, and /or other offensive behavior may be subject to removal from the Council Chambers.

Using the podium as a platform for campaigning is discouraged.

The Council will take comments under advisement but are not obligated to respond in any way. The Mayor reserves the right to modify these rules to effectively chair the meeting.

Among the rights available to the public is the right to access public data as provided by Minnesota Statutes, section 13.03, subdivision 2(b). The City of Chisholm requires a completed data request form, prior to granting such requests. Data request forms are available at City Hall and on the City of Chisholm's website.
